For June, July, and August sessions, campers may arrive between 9am and noon on opening day. Lunch for campers will be served at 12:30 p.m. Key Camp arrivals should be between 1:00pm and 3:00pm on opening day. On closing day, all campers should be picked up between 9am and noon. We cannot accommodate campers prior to opening day or after closing day of a session.

The camp fees are to be paid by check or credit card as follows:

Registration fee (\$750.00) – due with application
½ of the remaining balance – due by February 1, 2010
Remaining balance – due by April 1, 2010

As of May 1st, any past due account will result in cancellation of camper's enrollment with no refund of tuition. If you would like to pay a fixed amount by check each month, please contact the camp office for a payment schedule. A five percent reduction on tuition fees is made for two or more sisters who are attending camp.

CABIN GROUPS

Cabin groups are assigned by grade level. Campers are sent a cabin request card in a spring mailing. These requests can be honored if **both** campers are in the **same grade** and there are **no conflicting requests**. We cannot promise to place you as requested. We try to arrange cabins so that **no more than two campers** from the **same area** live in the same cabin.

TERMS

Tuition fees include all activities, including daily horseback riding lessons, services of camp infirmary, laundry, and transportation. Applications are accepted for a full term only. Reservations are made only upon receipt of a signed application accompanied by the required deposit. Enrollment is limited to 124 campers. Returning campers have priority over new campers if the application is received by October 1st. After October 1st, all applications are accepted on a first come, first served basis. **EARLY APPLICATION IS ADVISABLE**. If cancellation is necessary, the deposit, less a \$150 processing fee, is refundable if written notice is received prior to February 1st. After February 1st, there will be no refunds for cancellation of registration. We highly recommend you consider purchasing camp/summer study insurance. The director reserves the right to dismiss any camper who violates the camp rules or is judged detrimental to the general welfare of the camp. No refund will be made in case of dismissal. The director also reserves

the right to refuse the acceptance of any applicant who in her judgment will neither benefit from nor contribute to the camp experience.

VISITATION

Attending camp provides an extraordinary opportunity for campers to gain the self-reliance, self-confidence, and independence important to a young girl's development. Therefore, the camp program should not be interrupted with visits by parents and relatives. We highly recommend parents visit camp on opening and closing days of the camp session. At this time, parents are encouraged to meet the staff and view the camp facility. There are no facilities for housing or feeding visitors at camp. Local accommodation information may be found at www.keystonecamp.com.

NO PACKAGE POLICY

Our philosophy is that allowing packages creates a competitive environment with campers trying to receive the best package or the most packages. With this in mind, the only packages accepted at Keystone Camp will be fruit baskets containing only fresh fruit in its natural state (unpeeled, unprocessed). All other packages (including oversized envelopes) will be returned to sender unopened unless specific arrangements have been made with our office. We will provide information on companies who send nice fruit baskets in a spring mailing.

HEALTH AND MEDICAL INFORMATION

In case of illness or accident where an outside physician is called or where it is found necessary to send a camper to a hospital or to a doctor, parents are expected to bear the expense. The services of our resident Registered Nurse and our camp infirmary are furnished without charge. A camp health form to be filled out by your daughter's physician will be mailed to you in a spring mailing.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Since our phone facilities are very limited we do not permit our girls to use the phone except in the case of an emergency and then the call must be cleared by the director. If you have concerns about your daughter, please feel free to call the director. The camp office is open each day from 8:30 a.m. until 5 p.m. You are encouraged to call during these hours. All expenses are handled through the camper's spending money account. Camp is not responsible for lost or damaged articles. We do our best to return all lost and found items to their rightful owner during camp. All articles brought to camp--including shoes, socks, and underwear--should be clearly marked with the camper's full name and a list pasted in top of the trunk. If lost and found is not claimed within one week of the session's closing day, items are donated to a local shelter. Only one footlocker and one duffel bag may be brought to camp (or two comparable bags). Use of tobacco, alcohol and non-prescription drugs by campers will not be permitted. Use of inappropriate language, lying and stealing will not be tolerated.

TRAVEL SUGGESTIONS

Girls may travel to camp by plane or automobile. Campers arriving by plane will be met on opening day and transported on closing day to the Asheville, NC Airport or the Greenville/Spartanburg Airport at no charge. If your daughter is flying to camp, please send a small carry-on bag with a change of clothes, tennis shoes, and a bathing suit. Airline reservations should be made as early as possible due to limited flights into and out of Asheville and Greenville/Spartanburg. Please schedule arrivals and departures between 10:00 AM and 12:00 Noon.

WHAT TO BRING

A packing list of suggested items to bring to camp will be mailed in a spring mailing. A list is also posted on our website under Parent Information.

WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP

Cell phones, pagers, digital cameras, TVs, DVDs, palm pilots, game boys or other electronic games, headphones, valuable jewelry, or cash do not have a place in the camp environment. Please leave these items at home. Cell phones for travel from camp should be turned in to the camp office to be held until closing day.
